

JUNE 8, 2010 CALIFORNIA PRIMARY ELECTION RESULTS

BAY AREA LOCAL TAX INCREASES

ALAMEDA

No:

Berkeley Swimming Pools, lost with 60% support for \$56-\$70 parcel tax increase

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY

Yes:

Mt. Diablo Schools, won with 60% support for \$348 bond sale (needed 55% to win*)

West Contra Costa (Richmond), won with 62% support for \$380 million bond*

Kensington Police services, won with 70% support for "up to" \$200 parcel tax increase

No:

El Sobrante Police services, lost with 55% opposed to \$36 parcel tax increase

May 2010 special ballot: Lafayette-Orinda area high schools, won with 68% for \$112 increase in parcel tax

MARIN COUNTY

Yes:

Libraries in Marin County (74% yes) San Anselmo (74% yes) and San Rafael (69% yes) won \$49 parcel tax increases for five years

NAPA COUNTY – no tax or bond measures on ballot

SAN FRANCISCO

Yes:

Schools earthquake & safety repairs, won with 72% support for up to \$32 parcel tax

Public Building earthquake retrofit, won with 79% support for \$412 million bond

SAN MATEO COUNTY

Yes:

Cabrillo Schools, won with 70% support for \$150 increase in parcel tax

Community Colleges, close pending count of absentees, on June 10
66% support for \$34 parcel tax increase for 4 years

*In special elections held Feb 2010-May 2010 Foster City, Burlingame,
Portola Valley and Menlo Park won super majority to ok parcel tax
increases for schools to cover budget cuts*

SANTA CLARA COUNTY

Yes:

North County Libraries (Los Altos) Measure L, 76% vote yes to \$24
increase parcel tax

Milpitas, Oak Grove, Mount Pleasant and Alum Rock Schools won super
majorities for parcel tax increases for schools

Mountain View-Los Altos, and Los Gatos Schools won super majorities
for bonds

*In special elections in May 2010 super majorities approved parcel tax
increases for schools in Palo Alto, Fremont, Lakeside & Union districts;
parcel tax defeated for Loma Prieta Schools*

SOLANO COUNTY-- no tax or bond measures on ballot

SONOMA COUNTY

Yes:

Votes still being counted for school bonds in Mark West Dist., and
parcel tax for Russian River Fire Dept, as well as sales tax increase in
Rohnert Park.

In special election in April 2010 Cotati approved a sales tax increase
